Submission of Wells Neighbourhood Plan to Mendip District Council and thence Somerset Council under The Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012.

- 1. Following approval of the draft Plan at the meeting of the Council on the 22nd of December last year, the Consultation Statement and Basic Conditions Statement have been prepared and considered by the meeting of the Planning and Environment Committee on the 16th of this month.
- 2. The purpose of the Consultation Statement is to provide a narrative of
 - who has been consulted
 - a summary of the main issues raised and
 - how these have been addressed by the Council.
- 3. The purpose of the Basic Conditions Statement is to confirm that the Neighbourhood Plan
 - takes into account the National Planning Policy Framework
 - contributes to the achievement of sustainable development
 - confirms with the Local Plan and
 - is compatible with European obligations and human rights requirements.
- 4. The next step is for the Plan together with the two Statements together with Neighbourhood Plan and associated documents (which are held on the Council's website) to be formally approved by the Council and then submitted to Mendip District Council who will then pass it to Somerset Council.
- 5. Somerset Council will then carry out a more formal and less detailed consultation process and then pass the Plan to an Independent Examiner. Finally, a referendum will take place when the question will be "Do you want Somerset Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan to help it decide planning applications in the Neighbourhood Area?". A minimum of 50% of those voting would be required for the Plan to be adopted. There would be no minimum turnout for the referendum to be valid.
