### Somerset Bus Partnership Report

**SBP AGM** was held this week- attended by Rosa Kell who has agreed to become the lead person for Wells Bus User Group. The SBP continues to work hard on behalf of the 11 bus user groups of Somerset. It has a membership of 56 people.

### Wells Bus User Group achievements for 2022-2023 were:

Running successful bus stalls and events raising awareness
Developing a list of local supporters providing a focus for future actions
Establishing links with Wells bus depot
Setting-up an off-shoot 'Save the 126' campaign
Developing links with Cheddar and Glastonbury bus groups

Headline Notes from the latest survey by Transport Focus on the £2 fare cap, conducted between 24-26 March 2023.

40% of people said bus journeys were replacing ones they would have made by car, and that 11% of respondents were using the bus to travel more - up from 7% in January.

In a boost for those in favour of Youth Discounts and the "Solidaire" style fare we have in Brittany, usage of the £2 capped fare is highest among under 24s and people with lower household incomes.

Also, the South West scores highly compared to other regions when respondents are asked whether the £2 capped fare will encourage people to try the bus, and whether it might personally save them money.

Interesting also to note that the Office for National Statistics has said the £2 fare cap was a contributing factor in inflation slowing down in January - see also https://www.bbc.com/news/business-65177420
